There will be plenty of time to socialize, and an extra pair of hands is always welcome.

If you plan to build a plane at the meeting, please bring a check for \$45 payable to "Charles River RC", a hot glue gun with glue sticks, a hobby knife, a cutting mat, and a metal ruler. Needle nose pliers, a 2mm allen wrench, a 1.5mm allen wrench, and a servo tester would also be helpful if you have them.

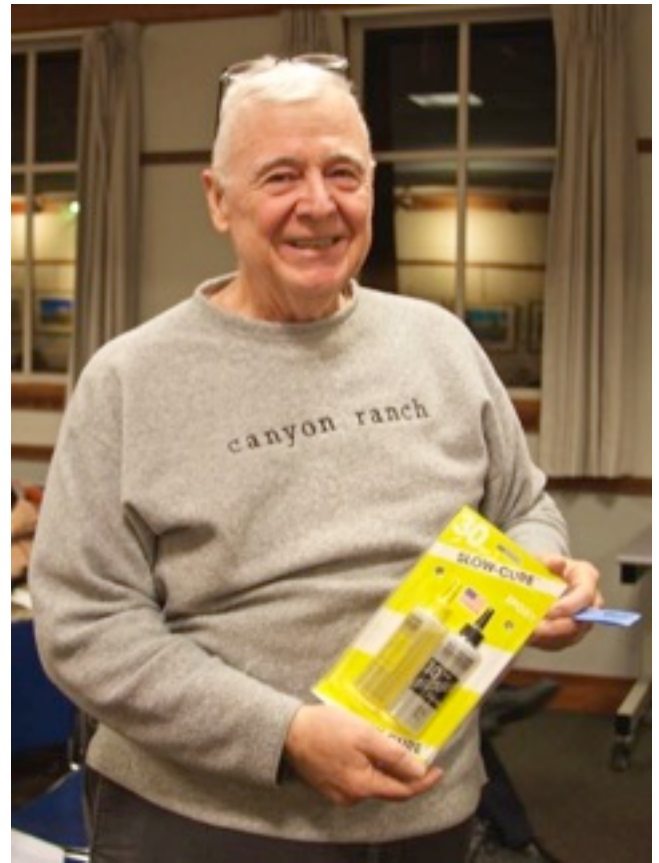

Brian's class at MIT



Brian's report

After the December CRRC meeting, when I was promoting our February "Build Night" meeting, Professor Dan Frey asked if I would be willing to do the same program as part of his class at MIT. Geek that I am, I could not say no to an opportunity to help teach a class at MIT, so I agreed. After exchanging a few emails, we agreed that I should bring materials to build a few different planes: 3 Nifty combat planes, 3 Simple Deltas, and 4 Nut Balls. Dan had plenty of servos, receivers, transmitters, and batteries, so I only had to order foam, motors, ESCs, props, and hardware. I traced the parts for all the planes onto sheets of foam in advance.

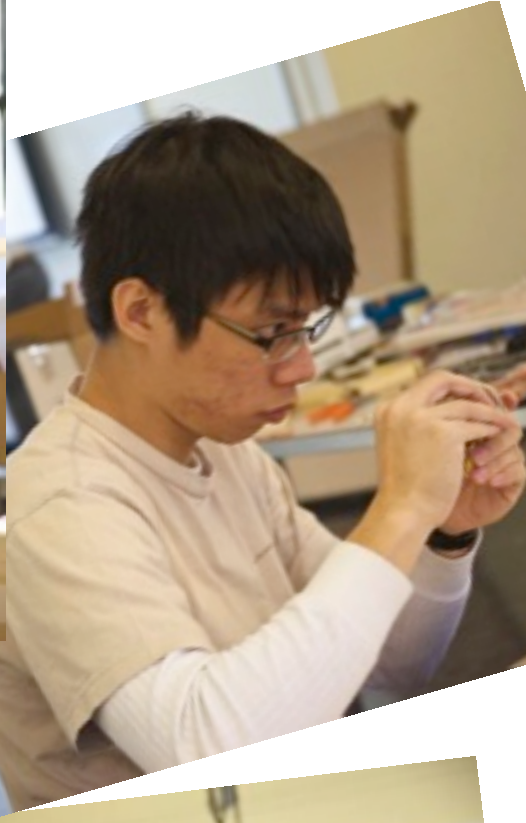
On the day of the event, 10 (out of 16) students attended this session, which is good since I had only prepared materials to build 10 planes. I worked with the students from about 8 am - 12 noon. We assembled all 10 planes in that time. About half of them were really

completed, with electronics installed, receivers bound to transmitters, and all functions tested. Dan said he'd be able to assist the remaining students with radio hookup and testing at the next session.

The class was a bit chaotic, but almost all of them were able to complete their planes with a minimal amount of assistance. I'd demonstrate the basic assembly of each plane to one or two students, and they would show everybody else who was building that model what to do, everybody was having a good time. Dan was a great help too. He supervised a lot of the radio gear installations and made sure everyone had access to all the tools they needed.

Dan expressed great appreciation for all the help CRRC provided for this class and said he'd try to attend more of our meetings in the future.

Keep CA debonder handy. More than once this winter, I've been stuck to a piece of wood and I've known people to get attached to things a little heavier like the basement floor. Don't panic when attached, add a little debonder and roll the attached skin off the offending object. It will take time, so work slowly and persistently using plenty of liquid. If you've done the unthinkable and touched your eye with CA, you'll need to call for professional help and abandon the debonder.

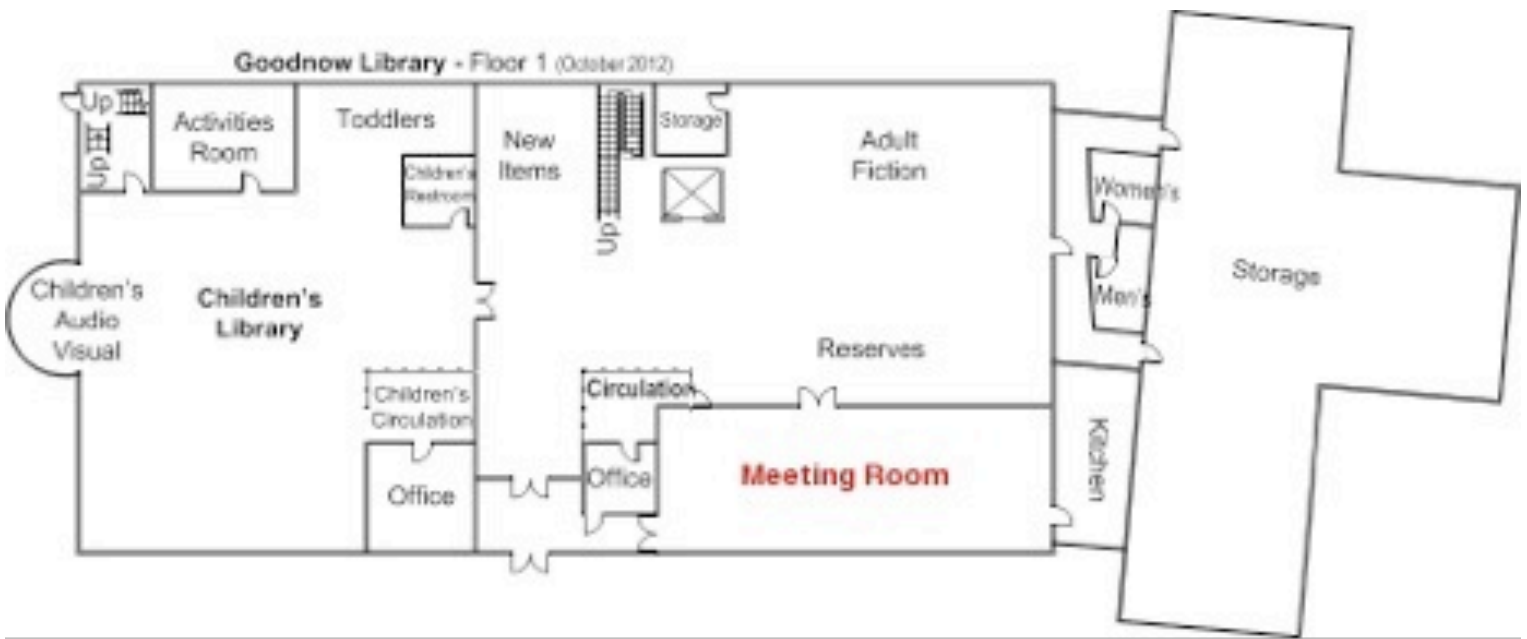

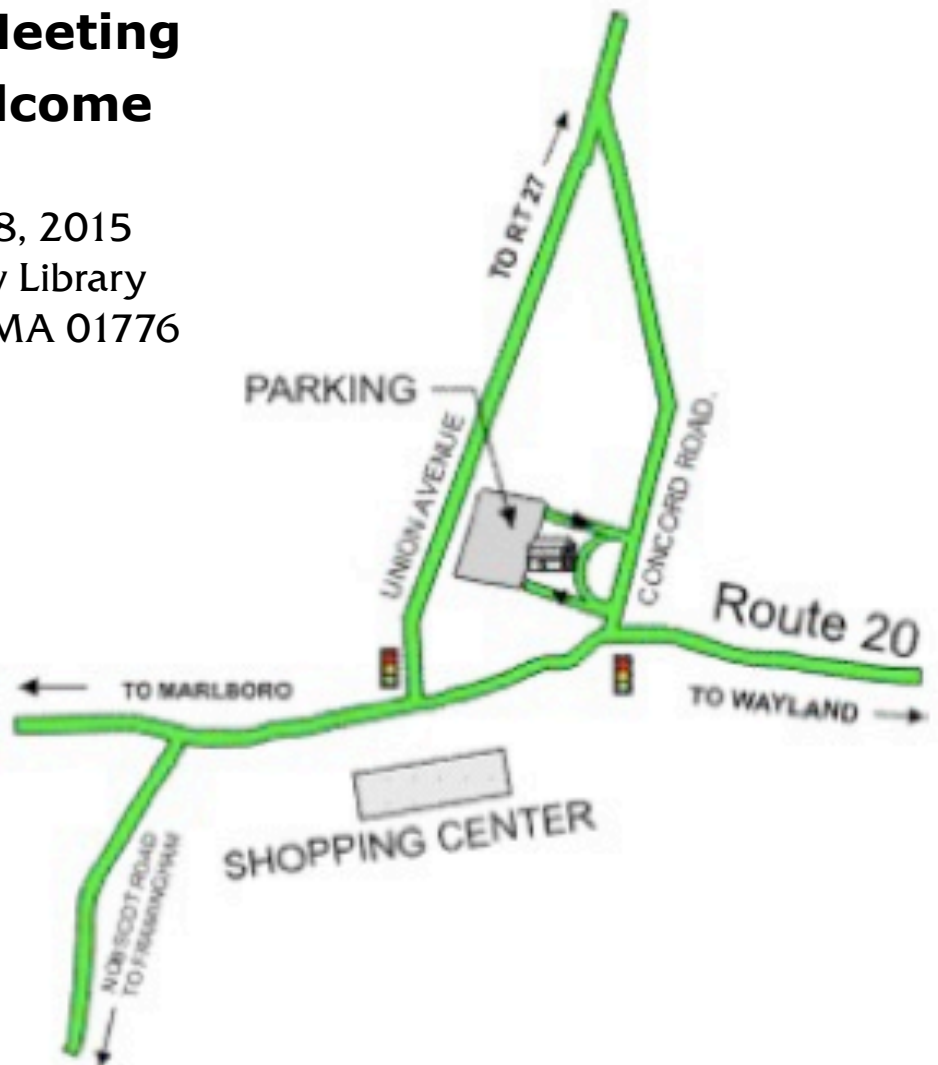
